A. <u>CUSTER COUNTY YOUTH 4-H/ FFA PROJECTS:</u> A project must meet the approved guidelines set forth by the Board of Directors (BOD) prior to approval. One project is defined as a "Supervised Animal Agricultural Project". **Project approval will extend approximately twelve weeks and will terminate no later than July 25<sup>th</sup>.** The project will be subject to random inspections by two BOD members throughout the duration of the project. If at any time the project poses a verifiable nuisance to a property located within one-half mile radius, the BOD will temporarily or permanently rescind project approval.

## BOD Guidelines for youth 4-H/ FFA project approval:

- Documentation will be provided to the Board to verify authenticity of approval and registration of projects.
- Project(s) shall not exceed two animals per child and six animals per household.
- Project(s) are limited and subject to the approval process. Steers will not be approved due to project length exceeding the 12 week allowance.
- On-site inspections will be conducted for housing and stall suitability prior to the approval of a project. The inspection will be conducted by two BOD members.
- Projects must be maintained in an enclosed building at all times with the exception of supervised training. (Training sessions will be conducted in a professional manner at all times)
- Each project must be maintained in a single stall secured at all times with a clip or like device for security purposes.
- A separate dumpster must be maintained on site for waste disposal and disposed of weekly for the duration of the project.
- An inspection will be conducted at the termination of project deadline by two BOD members to ensure the homeowner is in compliance with Blumenau covenant 16.
